OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO COMMUNITY FOOTBALL JACK HARRISON



In 1988 Jack was instrumental in the formation of the Grimsby, Cleethorpes and District Sunday Football League Benevolent Fund, a fund which supports players who are injured whilst playing football and lose income due to incapability to work. Following a serious injury to a player in 1987 which resulted in the player unfortunately having to undergo an amputation, the league committee decided that something needed to be in place for players, referees and assistants that go injured whilst participating in their league. Jack, club secretary of Tetney Rovers at the time volunteered his experience to support the set-up of the league fund. After the set-up of the fund, Jack became the Benevolent Fund secretary and worked tirelessly to support injured players and their entitlement through their claim. This often resulted in travelling around Grimsby and the local districts to sit with injured players and club officials at their home, explaining the processes and supporting with administrative tasks.

Jack is an extremely kind and caring individual who takes the time to listen to individuals and their needs and goes that extra mile to accustom them. To date Jack's hard-work and caring attitude has supported 1149 successful claims for players who have been injured whilst playing football, securing a total of £176,319 to injured claimants.



OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO REFEREEING IAN STEPHENSON



lan has been one of the main focal points of Refereeing in Lincoln for the past 30 years. Few Referees manage to be consistently popular with Players and Managers the way he has with his ready wit and personable style. After many years Officiating in the Semi Professional game it was his affinity with the Lincoln Sunday game that he is best known for. Regularly winning the Referee of the Year Award he took on the onerous task of Referee Selector. He has helped countless Referees through their first tentative steps into adult football and has devoted countless hours to the grassroots game. He has now moved on to be secretary of the League and it is only right that his contribution to Refereeing in Lincolnshire is marked in this way.

YOUNG REFEREE AWARD (18-25 YEARS) **ASHLEY BALDOCK-SMITH**



Ashley Refereed his first adult Cup Final at the tender age of 16 after a notable first season in the Peterborough League which also saw him win the Young Referee of the Year Award. His potential has been recognised nationally after securing a place in the Eastern Region Centre of Referee Excellence – CORE. At just 18 he has just been voted joint Referee of the Year Award in the Peterborough League. He has already represented Lincolnshire on two County Finals he is deservedly the Young Referee of the Year.

MALE REFEREE AWARD ALISTAIR WILSON



Alistair has been Officiating in the Semi Professional game for the past 10 years but in the last two years he has truly come of age. A Level 3 Referee he has developed into one of the most reliable and consistent Officials in the County and his excellent season saw him rewarded with a National Play Off Semi Final at Royston. Off the pitch he is Chairman of Boston RA as well as a County Assessor. For his all round contribution to Refereeing in Lincolnshire he is rightly the Referee of the Year.

WOMEN REFEREE AWARD CLAIRE WEST



Claire may be diminutive in stature but is a larger than life figure on the pitch. Her fitness and charisma mean she is a hugely respected figure on the Local Leagues in Scunthorpe and she is hoping to progress to Supply League Football next season. FA National RESPECT Award Winners

BOSTON AND DISTRICT SATURDAY FOOTBALL LEAGUE



At a time when Boston is regularly in the news regarding the influx of immigrants to the Town. The Boston and District Saturday Football League has been playing its part in their integration. Eastern European Football Club, made up entirely of foreign nationals, applied to enter the League for season 2014-15. The league have embraced the team and helped them evolve to become part of the league. The league committee sat with the club, working through the admin to join the league and 27 international clearance forms to submit to The FA allowing all the club's players to play within the league. Alongside the support around administration, the league committee worked with existing clubs, supporting Eastern European Football Club with 'mentor clubs' helping them integrate throughout the season. The Boston and District Saturday Football League signed up to The Football Association Respect Programme upon its inception in 2008, receiving it's Respect League Certificate in 2011, and winning a Silver Award in The FA Respect and Fair Play Awards 2012/13 for its work with the Respect Programme. The Boston and District Saturday Football League has around 1,400 players registered each season of which 3% were foreign nationals. However, with the advent of Eastern European Football Club the participation figure for foreign nationals has doubled to 6%. Our League feels that there must be other players in the foreign national community who want to play football and we are hopeful that through the successful integration of Eastern European Football Club that they will see that.
